


- Accident Data from 1.950 Locations employing over 65,000 people

- The Contractor Passport Scheme was developed for the Quarry Industry in the U.K.
- The Scheme was launched in late 2004 in Ireland – to date nearly 2,000 Contractors in Ireland and 16,500 in the U.K have completed the course
