Hot Bitumen Burns

WHAT HAPPENED

The following advice was issued by a UK company to it's sites, following an incident where a bitumen delivery driver suffered splashes of hot bitumen to skin and facial areas.



Visor

LEARNING POINTS / ACTIONS TAKEN

Confirm – that the delivery driver has been trained to Refined Bitumen Association standards; Ask to see their RBA competence card.

Ensure – that there is an exclusion zone in place during delivery.

Pipe Connection points – do all your tank delivery points have splash covers (flange covers)?

Shower – does your emergency shower work, have an audible and visual alarm fitted or is it visible from the batch cabin?

Site Staff — are staff trained and familiar with the

site emergency procedures?

Ensure – cameras are working, consider recording the discharge.

Permit – ensure you complete a bitumen discharge permit before discharging takes place.

Remind drivers – to fully comply with all emergency procedures and complete an ADT (authority to continue discharge) if a spillage is evident prior to recommencing delivery, and in agreement with the Site Supervisor.

Plants – must have emergency PPE standards to that of the RBA delivery driver requirements in case person retrieval is needed.
