Dangerous Counterfeit Hard Hats

WHAT HAPPENED

The British Safety Industries Federation (BSIF) has been made aware that counterfeit and substandard safety helmets believed to be of Asian origin and marked under the brand name "Burly" and "MkII" have found their way onto the international market.

These helmets are copies of the well-known MkII® safety helmet, a product manufactured by JSP® in the UK and should not be confused as being one and the same.

The "Burly" helmets do not meet the requirements of the British and European Standard, EN397. The photograph demonstrates the counterfeit helmet which was broken by applying hand pressure to its sides.

LEARNING POINTS / ACTIONS TAKEN

The counterfeit helmets are extremely dangerous:

they must not be worn and should be destroyed immediately.
